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What Does The Church of Jesus Christ Believe?

Missionary trip to Holbrook Arizona

He saw the need for the Gospel to be preached there, he told me that he felt like Abraham, when God spoke to him and told him to go to a land that I'll show you, and thou shall be a blessing. I thank God for men like Bro. Stone, willing to leave his home in Illinois and go by faith to help lost souls find salvation through the name of Jesus Christ.

Acts 2:38 in Navaho

Bishop Spence and I left from WV on the 14th of August and arrived in Holbrook Arizona on the 16th. We called Bro. Stone and he asked us to come over to his home and the church to get better acquainted. We found Bro. Stone and his family very hospitable, as they fed us a wonderful meal. But the fellowship in the word of God was truly a blessing as we found Bro. Stone to be very receptive to the doctrine of The Name of Jesus Christ. Bro. Stone has always believed in baptism in the Name of Jesus Christ, but never was taught the importance of the name on the building. The more we discussed the scriptures, the more he saw what we were saying about not saying and using the term Jesus name which isn't biblical. We have many oneness people today that has made a doctrine out of that term, and put everything on their place of worship except his wonderful name. Isaiah 9:6 and Colossians 3:17. The scriptures teach us that the church is his body and he is the head of the body. Ephesians 1:22-23 and Colossians 1:18-24. My pastor Harvey H. Perry, preached this message for 50 years and had a wonderful illustration of this through, he would use his own body and head to prove this point about the church being called by the name of Jesus Christ, he would say if I Stick my head through the door and you knew who I am you would say I know who that is, that's Harvey Perry, it would be ridiculous to call my body by some other name

than the name of my head. This may seem silly to some people, but in 1 Corinthians 1:27 Paul wrote that God chose the foolish things of the world to confound the wise. Chapter 2:14 he writeth but the natural man receivieth not it things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness unto him, neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

Also in Romans 1:20 he wrote For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse. Bro. Stone had a special service Friday night and we got to meet some of the Saints, they were mostly Native Americans, and they were very friendly and received us well. We had a wonderful and God was certainly in our midst. We had a great meal and fellowship afterwards.

Friday Bro. Stone took us up into the White Mountains to Fort Apache, and the Apache Reservation. It was a beautiful day and we got to see a church on the Reservation and as we were standing outside one of the natives came and asked us to pray for him and then a car pulled into the parking lot and the two ladies asked us to pray for them. Matthew9:37 &38 The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labors are few. Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth laborers into his harvest. John 4:35 Say not ye, there are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold I say unto you Lift up your eyes and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest.





Sunday service was wonderful, had a full house. Bishop Spence preached, "Crying to God!" A lot of people are crying to a god that cannot hear and cannot save. (1Kings 18:21-40) After the service the sisters prepared us a great meal of Navaho tacos, they made fried bread for the tacos, it was delicious.



I believe God is bringing his people together in these last days. Acts 15:14-17; Simeon hath declared how God at first did visit the Gentiles, to take out of them a people for his name. And to this agree the words of the prophets; as it is written, After this I will return and build again the tabernacle of David which is fallen down; and I will build again the ruins thereof, and I will set it up: That the residue of men might seek after the Lord, and all the Gentiles, upon whom my name is called, saith the Lord, who doeth all these things.

I want to say how grateful I am, for Bishop Spence having the vision of going out and declaring the gospel wherever he gets the opportunity. The Native Americans of the Southwest are a wonderful people and I believe there is going to be a great harvest of souls for the Kingdom of God, they are quick to receive the words of the Lord. Like the Jews on the day of Pentecost, in Acts2:37 as Peter was preaching they said unto Peter and the rest of the apostle's men and bretheren what shall we do? They didn't get upset and mad at the preacher, remember the word pricked their heart, they were convicted of their sin, they wanted to be saved, they wanted salvation. Peter told them what they needed to do. Acts 2:38- Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. This is the message of the church Jesus Christ said in Matthew 16:18 he was going to build. Thank the Lord it is still the message today, Paul said in Galatians 1:8- though we or an angel from heaven preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached let him be accursed.

I want to say how thankful I am for Bro. Stone, for the burden and vision he has for the Navaho people. I also saw the love and respect the people have for him. Bro. Stone now has a new sign on the place of worship that he has placed on the home mission it reads: The Church of Jesus Christ.

Leave the Landmarks Alone!

"Thou shalt not remove thy neighbour's landmark, which they of old time have set in thine inheritance, which thou shalt inherit in the land that the Lord thy God giveth thee to possess it" (Deut. 19:14).

A "landmark" is a mark that designates where your land ends and your neighbor's land begins. Modern surveyors drive a metal rod into the ground to separate and distinguish property, but ancient landmarks often consisted of a stone that could be removed by someone wishing to encroach upon his neighbor's land. God pronounced a "curse" upon any man who would dare to so mistreat his fellow-Hebrew (Deut. 27:17). This was because after God divided up the Promised Land amongst the children of Israel in the Book of Joshua, He commanded them that it not be sold (Lev. 25:23; Num. 36:7). This is why Naboth refused to sell his land to Ahab (I Kings 21:1-3). Naboth wasn't being *stubborn* or *disrespectful* to his king, he was being *faithful* to the Law of his God (cf. Ezek. 46:18).

Landmarks to this day continue to mark where your land ends and your neighbor's land begins. However, today we also have certain societal landmarks that God has given to help us distinguish between right and wrong. For instance, for thousands of years, mankind clearly understood where to draw the line between right and wrong when it came to the subject of abortion. Then in 1973, our Supreme Court removed the landmark when they legalized abortion, and we have been living with the holocaustic consequences of this "landmark decision" ever since. Now societal surveyors are taking aim at yet another God-given landmark, the definition of marriage that limits it to the bond that can only exist between a man and a woman in the eyes of God. Such landmarks also exist in the spiritual realm of Bible doctrine. The historic fundamentals of the faith that define Christianity have for centuries helped God's people determine where truth ends and error begins. These spiritual landmarks are always under attack, and the day in which we live is no exception. To counter this trend that was present even in his own day, the Apostle Paul challenged young Timothy:

"Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus" (II Tim. 1:13). While we should always be open to receiving new understanding from God's Word "with all readiness of mind" (Acts 17:10,11), we must "prove all things" and "hold fast" *only* "that which is good" (I Thes. 5:21). We have a rich "inheritance" in Christ (Eph. 1:11,14) that these landmark doctrines serve to protect. Let's work together to preserve them!

I knew they could tell I was scared because I was climbing slowly. I finally got to the top of the ladder and had another problem. The saw the caretaker gave me was way too big for this kind of job. I was cutting limbs not the whole tree! The saw was so heavy I couldn't pick it up and saw with one hand. So I had to let go with both hands and try to hold on with my legs then cut the limbs off. I will tell the truth--I would have never limbed the ladder, but I had two good brothers holding the ladder for me. The moral to this story is don't be scared to let go with both hands and serve the Lord because there will be some good brothers and sisters holding up that spiritual ladder for you and wont let you fall.
